FROM THE SCHOOL BOARD

The East Kenwick Primary School Business Plan 2020-2023 has been inspired from the feedback gained from school based and Board surveys of parents, students and staff and recommendations from our previous external review.

In developing the Plan, the Board and school have utilised data, gathered evidence from reviews and analysed the information using a disciplined dialogue to identify areas for improvement. In addition, we have referenced and aligned our Business Plan with the Education Departments strategic direction and Focus documents.

Our commitment to continuous improvement follows the teaching and learning cycle of Review, Plan, Act and Monitor at a whole school level.

Review - data across the whole school in cluster, phase of learning teams and committees to determine the focus of our teaching and learning programs.

Plan - Develop Operational Plans to address areas of identified need through consultation and collaboration so they are owned by staff.

Act - Implement the agreed planning and adapt them to suit individual students that require a differentiated curriculum.

Monitor- Student performance is monitored, data collected and results are uploaded into our Monitoring Information System (MIS)
